

Instructions for transport partners

- Transports of dangerous goods according to the ADR regulations -

If transports of dangerous goods are part of the cooperation (appendix 1 of the frame contract), the following points must be observed in accordance with the ADR regulations:

1. Your driver must have a valid ADR-certificate at any time.
2. Each vehicle crew member must have the following dangerous goods equipment completely available in the vehicle in accordance with the ADR standard (example views on page 2):
 - ✓ protective gloves
 - ✓ reflective vest
 - ✓ jetting liquid for eyes
 - ✓ collecting tray (bucket)
 - ✓ channel covering
 - ✓ shovel / brush
 - ✓ emergency escape mask
 - ✓ torch (plastics)
 - ✓ safety glasses

In addition, the driver must carry the "written instructions" printed in colour in a valid version in a language that he can read and understand.

3. Only vehicles that are equipped with a complete dangerous good equipment are allowed to be used for ADR-transports. Dangerous goods equipment includes (examples on p. 2):
 - ✓ 2 orange warning signs with the appropriate fixing material
 - ✓ stop-blocks for each transport unit
 - ✓ 2 stand-alone warning signs (towing vehicle 1, megatrailer 2)
 - ✓ 2 tested and plumbed fire extinguisher with a total of 12 kg powder mass

Before a transport of dangerous goods, the vehicle (including trailers) has to be marked corresponding to the ADR regulation with orange warning signs. If these are not available, please add them from your stock.

4. Before starting, your drivers have to check the transported goods for correct markings and conditions. It is not allowed to transport packages, which are damaged or leaky.
5. The needed loading security needs to be checked and, if necessary, to be undertaken by your drivers.
6. At the take-over of the dangerous goods, the drivers have to secure that they receive a proper transport document for road haulage from the sender. If it is a transport by ferry, a completely filled in IMO declaration is necessary.

For ferry transports, additional ADR stickers are affixed to all 4 sides of the trailer in the port. These are ONLY valid for the respective ferry transport (this is maritime law) and must be removed immediately after unloading, otherwise it can lead to major problems with the police, the BAG or other authorities.

7. Your drivers have to adapt their manner of driving to the dangerous goods. Stop in fog, snow, heavy rain or similar situations. In addition, appropriate caution and prudence must also be exercised during loading and unloading activities.
8. You have to instruct your drivers about changes in the law about dangerous goods at least once a year.
